- June 17; <u>The Netherlands</u> announced the five main themes for its participation in Expo 205: 1) life science and health, 2) energy, sustainability and circular economy, 3) sustainable food production and horticulture, 4) high-tech and digitalisation and 5) culture.

<u>Argentina</u> and <u>Niue</u> will not participate due to domestic circumstances, while <u>Sierra</u>


<u>Leone</u> and <u>Barbados</u> newly announced their participation. The total number of participating countries remains the same at 161.

#### 2. Reports from the past week and plans for the upcoming week

- June 24; <u>The Secretary General of the BIE, Mr. Dimitri Kerkentzes</u>, paid a courtesy call on Prime Minister Kishida.
- Prime Minister Kishida conveyed the significance of the Expo as a place where people from all over the world can meet and gain unexpected new experiences and confirmed that that all parties involved will work together to make the Expo a success.
- Secretary General Kerkentzes paid tribute to Prime Minister Kishida's leadership in preparing for the Expo and mentioned that the IPM to be held in Nara from May 25 will be an opportunity to promote the event throughout Japan.






Left: Prime Minister Kishida and Secretary General Kerkentzes

- June 24; Prior to the courtesy call on Prime Minister Kishida, <u>Secretary General Kerkentzes held a meeting with Mr. Saito, Minister of Economy, Trade, and Industry.</u>
- Secretary General Kerkentzes stated that participating countries were positive and supported Japan's efforts. Both sides agreed to continue to work closely together to build momentum and support the preparation of official participants.

- June 24; The One-Stop Shop (OSS) has officially opened on the 47th floor of the Sakishima Government Building in Osaka, in the same building as the Association.
- On the first day, June 24, approximately 120 people from 30 countries and international organisations visited to consult the OSS. The number of consultation categories has been expanded to a total of 26. In addition to online support, it provides consultations in person as well for administrative services in terms of permits and licenses.





- June 19; The Association and the <u>Cashless Promotion Council signed a partnership</u>

<u>agreement</u> on the promotion of cashless payments. The agreement encompasses promotional activities for cashless operations in the venue.

- June 20; The official character <u>Myaku-Myaku</u> made a guest appearance in a long-running <u>comedy play by Yoshimoto Corporation</u>, on of the largest entertainment agencies and Japan that will be exhibiting a private-sector pavilion at the Expo. This was the first time Myaku-Myaku conversed with a living person.









- June 19; The third issue of the <u>web magazine Monthly Japan Pavilion</u> was published. The topic of this issue is the Power of Microorganisms and Fermentation.







- June 22; <u>A new Osaka-Kansai Expo Official Store</u> opened in the Junkudo Bookstore Namba store. This brings the total number of physical official stores nationwide to 12.
